2.5.2 - Reforms initiated on Continuous Internal Evaluation(CIE) system at the institutional level (250 words)

For timely completion of syllabus, Guest Lecturers are appointed by the College. Induction and Orientation programs are organized by Colleges IQAC for new comers as an essential part of the post-admission process. The fresher is made familiar with the College and University norms and regulations. The main curriculum and awareness about extra-curricular and co-curricular activities is also conveyed to the students. Class wise teaching time table is displayed on the notice board of the College. Month wise teaching plan is prepared for each Course / Paper of all the UG PG classes. The conduction of internal assessment is a regular process and a part of curriculum and the marks obtained are added to the final scores in semester exams. Model / Internal exams for the UG classes are also conducted for preparing the students for the annual exams and

the marks obtained are added to the final scores in annual exams. This supports the main curriculum and provides better training and technological information to the students.

2.5.3 – Academic calendar prepared and adhered for conduct of Examination and other related matters (250 words)

The academic year of the College is in accordance with the affiliating University's Academic Calendar and hence starts in the month of July every year and ends in the month of June of the succeeding year. Academic calendar of the session starts with admission process of UG and PG classes for which advertisements through proper channels and transparency in the admission process is followed. Date of issue of admission forms and their submission is decided, declared and notified and displayed on the notice boards. Admissions to both UG and PG classes are provided on the basis of merit and Governments reservation policy for SC/ST/OBC students. New session for UG Part-I classes as well as for PG first Semester classes starts from the admission process is over. UG classes operate on annual basis while PG classes are divided into two Semesters per Academic year according to the University rules. Internal assessments for PG classes start in the month of October or November and April or May for first and third semester respectively every year. Model exams for the UG classes are also conducted in the month of January. Annual sports and prize distribution is celebrated in the month of January and February. Extracurricular and co-curricular activities are conducted in the month of December which includes those activities that help in grooming the personality and cultural aspects of the students. The active participation of the students in the annual function alerts them about their traditional and cultural values.
